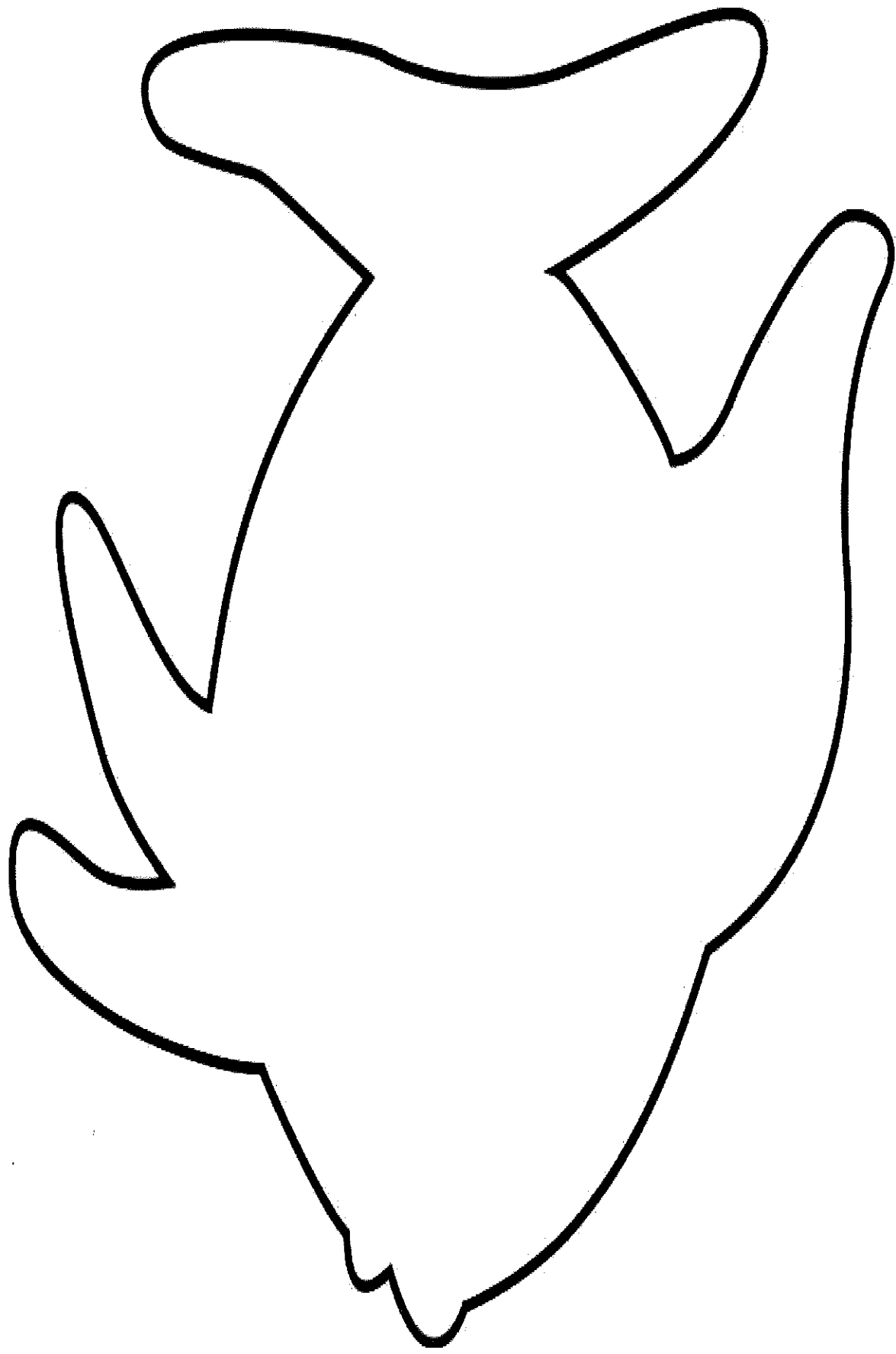

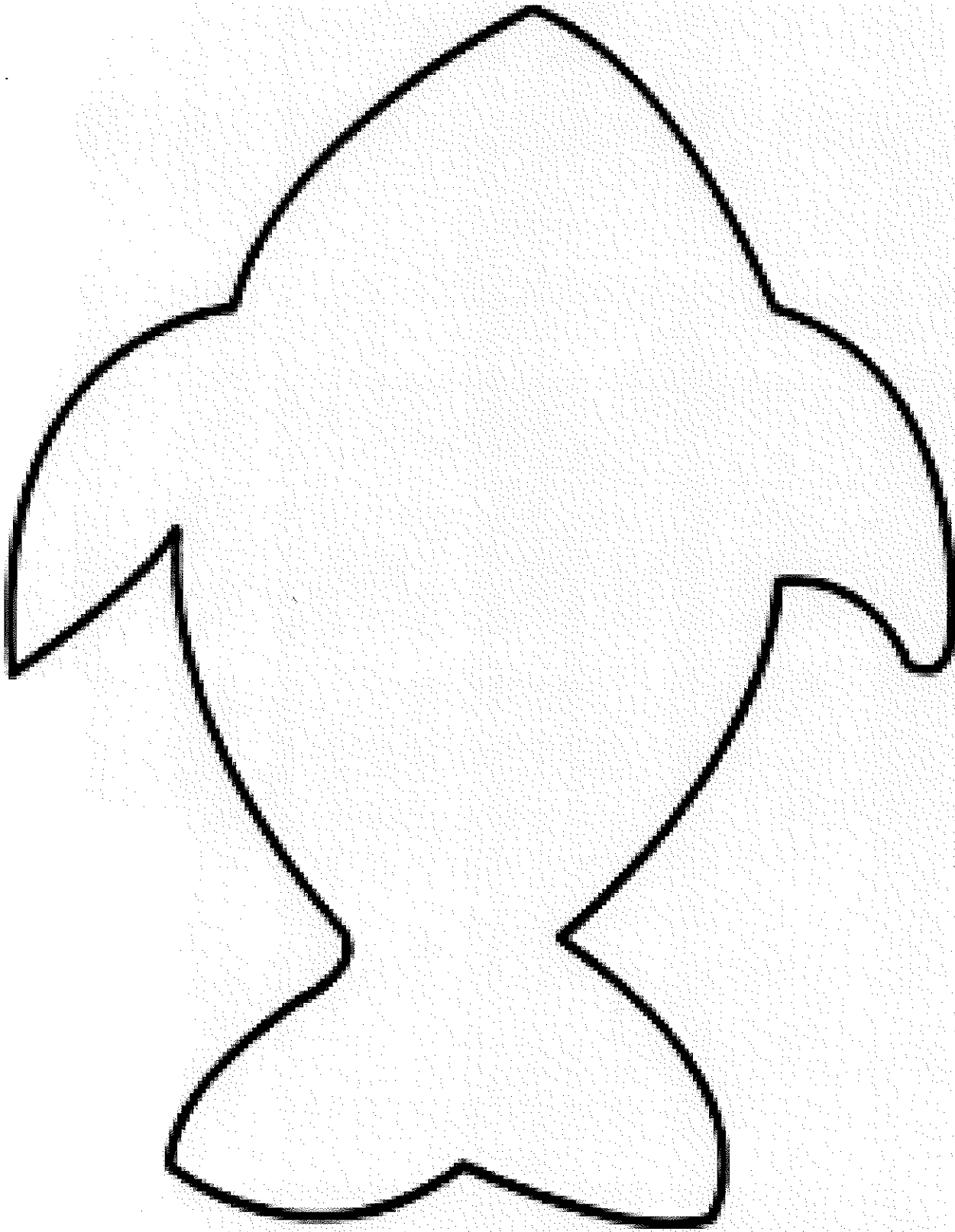
We hope you have an enjoyable, restful summer and remember “Reading Counts” and “Readers are Leaders”!

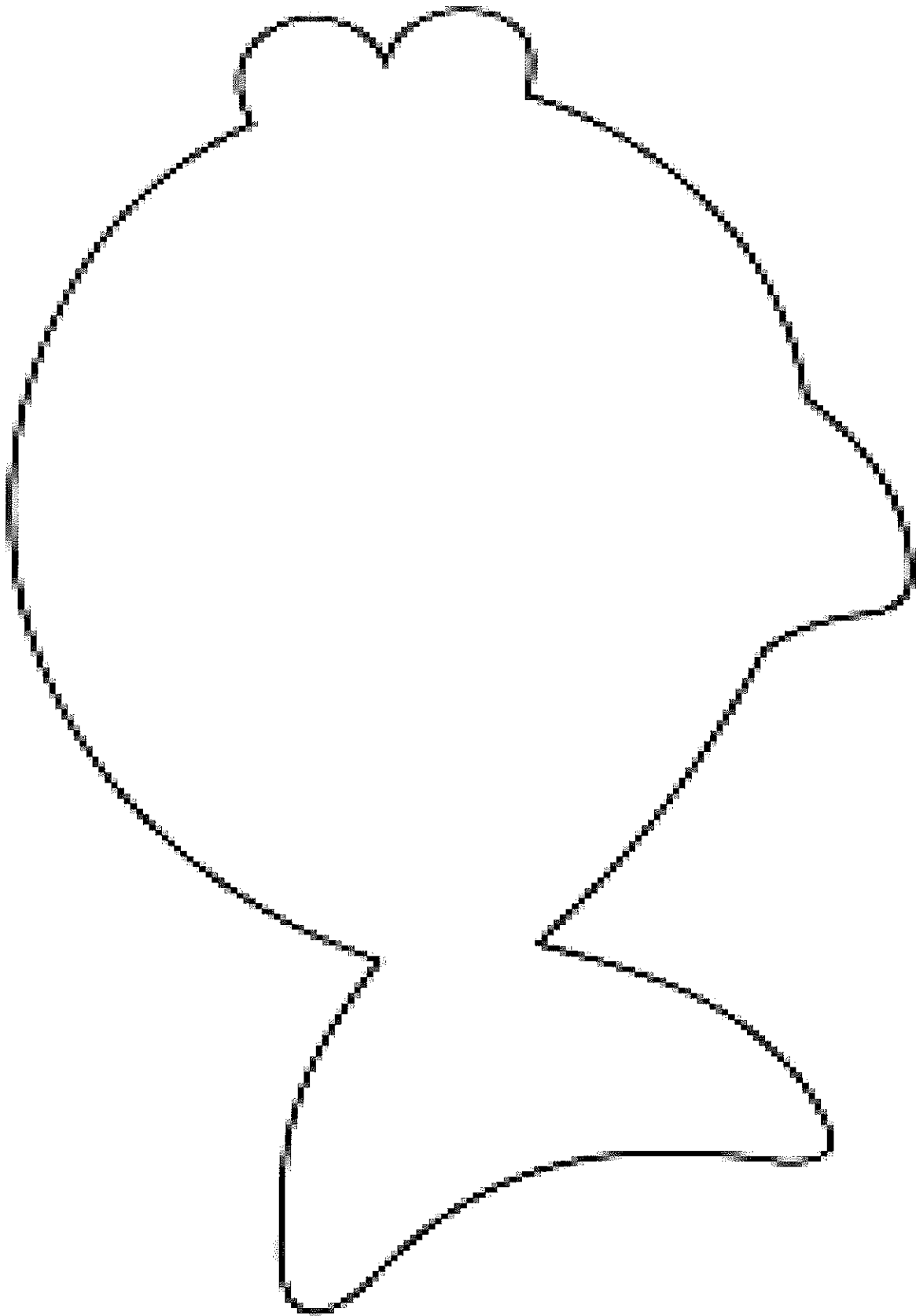
The Reading Department

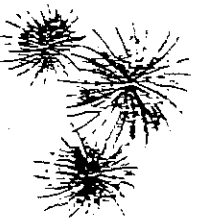

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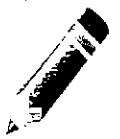
