#### Nurse News

Please remember to contact the school if your child is going to be absent and also provide an absent note which is required when they return to school.

\*Please ensure your child wears appropriate clothing for the changes in temperature/weather. We strive to have PE and recess outside unless it is raining or the "Real Feel" temperature is 20 degrees or below.

#### **ARRIVAL & DISMISSAL**

Abington Middle School hours are 7:50 a.m. to 2:22 p.m. Students should be seated in their homerooms at that time, ready to start the day. Parents who are dropping off their students will use the entrance to the left of the school building at Door 10 and follow the designated drop-off procedures. If a student arrives late, they

must sign in at the main office. Students who arrive after 8:30 a.m. must be accompanied by a parent or guardian. Students will be dismissed at 2:22 p.m. Parents who are picking up students should wait in the designated drop-off/pick-up area located to the left side of the building at Door 10 and follow the appropriate drop-off/pick-up procedures. Door 10 will be open between 7:20 a.m. and 7:50 a.m. for student drop-off. Students arriving after 7:50 a.m. should enter through the front door of the building and will be marked tardy.

#### **NOTES FROM HOME**

Parents must notify the school if your child is to be absent, tardy or dismissed. A *written* note must be submitted for each absence stating the date and reason for the absence. A note is also needed to *dismiss* your child from school or if your child will not be taking the bus home. Phone calls changing student dismissal plans can impact child safety. Thank you for cooperating with this important child safety issue.

#### **LAPTOP REMINDER**

Please have your student bring their charged laptop to school every day.

Also, please have them bring a water bottle to school every day. (Plastic water bottles please - no glass bottles).

#### HEADING TO SCHOOL!

What should I know?

Missing just one day of school every two-weeks is equal to 20-days per year, which is 4-weeks per year, and would equal 1.5 years of missed learning from Kindergarten to grade 12.

A day of missed school is a lost opportunity for academic growth and social development. By coming to school every day they're not sick, your child is gaining the academic and social skills to be successful in life

Throwing up or diarrhea




Eyes are pink and crusty
